

Hosting International Students

An important facet of an international student's stay in New Zealand is their homestay experience. Kaipara College will ensure a student's stay is comfortable, happy and positive. The staff in the International Student Department at Kaipara College take great care to place students appropriately.

Kaipara College homestay families have plenty of experience at hosting students. They know how to deal with students new to New Zealand and understand the problems they must overcome, such as homesickness, language difficulties and learning to live in a different culture.

We thoroughly assess all the homestay families before placing a student with them, and parents can feel confident that their children will be safe and well looked after during their stay in New Zealand. If a student does not feel comfortable with their homestay, then they will be moved to a different home.

The International Student Department has the welfare and progress of each international student as its primary goals. It maintains the communication flow with both the student's parents and their homestay parents.

Students can be met at the airport and transported to their homestay. There is an orientation programme in their first days at Kaipara College, which includes information about New Zealand culture and the school's systems. Throughout their stay in New Zealand students are fully supported by the International Student team, their classroom teachers, Deans and counsellors.

Academic - National Certificate of Educational Achievement (NCEA)

The National Certificate of Educational Achievement (NCEA) is well-recognised worldwide and can be gained in the last three years of secondary school. NCEA is an extremely flexible qualification and it consists of both internal assessments and external assessments to cater for different learning styles. Students sitting NCEA do not have the stress of preparing for one end of year examination that will decide their fate; they are assessed throughout the year with assignments, practical assessments, presentations, examinations and project work.

Kaipara College is located in the town of Helensville, on the North West edge of Auckland. It is one hour from the Auckland's International Airport and is 40 minutes' drive from the centre of the city. It has the best of the New Zealand countryside, while being very close to the city. Our students come from small communities and townships within the horticulture and farming regions, right on the edge of the city. People living in the area can easily get to the city and enjoy its facilities, while living close to beaches, golf courses and open spaces.

History of Kaipara College

The college was founded in 1924 as Helensville District High School, becoming Kaipara College in 1959. A devastating fire destroyed the last original classrooms and many years' worth of archives and resources belonging to the original school in December 2006.

The facilities of the school are impressive; modern and purpose built, enabling high quality teaching and learning to take place. The school is on a nine-hectare site, with over 80% of the buildings new or redeveloped since 2009. The growing school roll is leading to ongoing investment in state-of-the-art facilities over the next four years.



International Students Welcomed

International Students are welcome to our school either for short-term or long-term study. We provide an excellent ESOL programme, a special system of pastoral care, and recreational activities which ensure that international students gain full benefit from their time in New Zealand.
