#### **Our Story**

Kaipara College is a coeducational school situated in the town of Helensville in the beautiful South Kaipara district. Kaipara College serves a vibrant and diverse community from Riverhead and Muriwai in the South, to Glorit in the North. We are a community based school, with approximately 790 students accommodated in modern classrooms and specialist spaces. We are situated on Ngati Whatua land that is leased to the school by Nga Maunga Whakahii o Kaipara. Kaipara College celebrates the bicultural partnership of the Treaty of Waitangi and is committed to the integration of te reo and tikanga into the learning experiences of all our students. The College serves five local Ngati Whatua marae: Araparera, Haranui, Kakanui, Puatahi and Reweti.

At Kaipara College, we aim for students to pursue excellence working in partnership with their peers, their teachers, their family and whanau.

To enable this, we aim to deliver a curriculum that is learner centred and enables a passion for learning. We engage our learners through culturally responsive and relational pedagogy that exhibits best practise.

We aim to produce well rounded young adults who have multiple opportunities to experience success. To support this, we provide a high quality programme of cultural, sporting and performance based programmes that develop lifelong passions and friendships. Learners engage with others and are able to effectively reflect on their progress and develop successful improvement strategies.

Kaipara College understands the need to provide quality learning environments that are safe and inclusive. We afford students the very best opportunities to participate, enjoy and achieve within college life.

We seek to continue to develop connections with the wider community to enable collaboration that will help learners in the future.

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#### **Māori Dimensions and Cultural Diversity**

"He Māori ahau, e ako Māori nei, i tēnei kura e whakanui ana i tōku ao Māori " "I am a Māori, learning as a Māori, in this school that celebrates my Māori world".

Our community is located in the Ngati Whatua o Kaipara region, and we seek to embrace the tikanga and Te Reo Māori language that our tūpuna used. Staff are committed to delivering learning experiences that engage our students and build relationships that benefit both students, teachers and whanau.

Students are central to determining the direction of our culturally responsive and relational pedagogy. The student agency group, Te Ropu Rangitira, guides staff on their learning journeys, offering advice, support and encouragement.

Māori cultural activities are promoted through Kapa Haka, Powhiri, Waiata and the Whare Ako class that leads the celebration of Māori culture.

#### Pasifika

Kaipara College will endeavour to emphasize the importance of Pasifika identities, languages and cultures. Pasifika learners achieving is essential and improving attendance as a foundation for engagement in learning is a priority. Co-constructing with the Pasifika community and ensuring Pasifika students have agency within their learning. Celebrating Pasifika cultural diversity will ensure students and staff feel connected to their learning environment.

The cultural diversity of our student population is a key to our learners becoming respectful, tolerant and inquisitive of others individual identities.
