Community Update: Final plan for school opening for Year 9 and Year 10 students on Monday, 22 November

Kia ora Kaipara College Whānau

We have a number of updates for you today:

As already notified, Kaipara College will be open for Year 9 and Year 10 students to return to learning on site from **Monday, 22 November.** We are allowing a choice between **learning at home** or **learning at school** for our Year 9 and Year 10 students and ask each family to decide what is best for their student. In this way we are enabling equitable, inclusive and responsive teaching and learning to occur. We understand that this is a stressful time for many families who are trying to decide to do what is best for their children. The school will support whatever decision you make for your child and we will meet the learning needs of every student, no matter when they return to school.

Students who stay at home to learn will continue learning online as they have been doing. Work will continue to be put on the google classroom for each subject and live on-line teaching and learning will continue.

Students who come to school to learn will be working in their core class bubbles in a home room. Learning will continue online but will be supervised and supported by a teacher. This will enable students to reconnect with their peers and teachers, but will reduce the risk of the spread of COVID-19. Students will have a number of breaks outside (weather permitting) in designated "bubble" areas, rooms will be well ventilated and masks will be worn. Returning to learn at school will be under strict health and safety guidelines, to mitigate against the spread of COVID-19. Our emphasis is on implementing mitigation measures to limit transmission at school. These measures include the following.

Students who return to school must:

- Wear a mask at all times at school, unless eating or drinking
- Bring their own food and drink and not share food. The canteen will not be open and water fountains cannot be used
- Bring their own learning equipment as much as possible
- Wear school uniform
- Wear a mask on the bus to and from school (school buses will be running at regular times)
- Physically distance as much as possible
- Be at school to learn
- Stay at home if unwell
- Meet school expectations

Please note masks will need to be worn while on school grounds.
