### **Community Update: Welcome to 2022**

Kia ora koutou

Kei aku nui, kei aku rahi, tēnā koutou katoa i roto i ngā āhuatanga o te wā.

Welcome back after what we hope has been a wonderful summer for your whānau.

Our team is feeling refreshed and ready to go for the 2022 year and we are looking forward to welcoming everyone back onsite.

#### School in the RED setting

As you will be aware, all of NZ is now in the RED traffic light setting due to the spread of Omicron in the community. While this has been expected it still hurts when it happens!

Kaipara College is ready to focus on teaching and learning on site and the normal timetable will run. We are committed to working as safely as possible in the RED setting and are taking every opportunity to mitigate against the spread of Covid 19. For this reason the following are in place:

- All students and staff are required to wear masks while inside on site. Students are also required to wear masks on the bus to and from school. This is mandated by the Government and only official exemptions will be allowed. If your student has an official mask exemption, please forward a copy to Claire Farnan <u>cfarnan@kaipara.school.nz</u>. Students should also carry a copy of the exemption.
- All teaching and learning spaces will be well ventilated
- All staff are fully vaccinated
- Physical distancing while outside
- Hand washing and sanitizing reminders
- Contact tracing systems
- Stay at home if you are unwell
- No large gatherings

Unfortunately RED restrictions mean that we are unable to invite our whānau and community onsite for important events we normally would in Term 1, for example, a welcome for whānau of our new students, GATEWAY information evening, parent interviews and so forth. However, we will be running some of these events on-line, so keep an eye out for invitations to school events in your email and via our school newsletters. We really value this important connection with our school whānau and are committed to maintaining this collaborative relationship to ensure the best possible outcomes for our young people.

While COVID has disrupted all parts of our lives it is important that our young people continue to come to school for face to face teaching and learning and making connections with their peers and their teachers. We are really looking forward to working with you and your young person to help them set and achieve their 2022 goals.

Year 11 and Year 13 Tuesday 1 <sup>st</sup> February (10:00am-1:00pm) <i>School Hall</i>	Please note you are only required to attend course confirmation if there is a problem or issue with your 2022 timetable which can be viewed on KAMAR. Course confirmation is to be attended by students only. They must wear a mask at all times and socially distance. Uniform is not required. Course descriptions are available on <u>SchoolPoint</u> .
Year 12 Wednesday 2 <sup>nd</sup> February (10:00am-1:00pm) <i>School Hall</i>	Please note you are only required to attend course confirmation if there is a problem or issue with your 2022 timetable which can be viewed on KAMAR. Course confirmation is to be attended by students only. They must wear a mask at all times and socially distance. Uniform is not required. Course descriptions are available on <u>SchoolPoint</u> .

Thursday 3 <sup>rd</sup> February	All students on site. Start the day with whānau time and then into the normal timetable. Faculty of Special Education students will commence the day in Room 27 before moving to whānau classes.
