#### Junior students (Year 9 and 10)

Learning continues at school for our Y9 and Y10 students. They are spending time in whānau time and in subject lessons preparing for their exams in week 6. Our junior students have 2 hour exams in 4 of their core subjects. Here is the junior exam timetable.

Each exam will examine work covered through the year. The times of day will be adjusted so Period 2 is two hours long. All the exams will be in period 2. The students have been learning about the importance of having a revision plan and using specific strategies and techniques to help them remember information.
