Today marks the midway point for term two. The year is flying by and it won't be long before we hit exams at the start of term four. In her book The Happiness Project, author Gretchen Rubin talks about how "The days are long, but the years are short" when raising children. As a teacher, some days do feel long – particularly windy, stormy ones like earlier in the week – but then a year passes in the blink of an eye. Day to day, it can be hard to see the difference we make as teachers and parents, but those daily efforts do all add up. Please keep encouraging your students to put in little effort daily and remind them that it will add up to a big difference.

As you can see in the photos on page four, the Kaipara College team got behind the Pink Shirt Day message of "Speak Up, Stand Together, Stop Bullying" (Kōrero Mai, Kōrero Atu, Mauri Tū, Mauri Ora) this month. On the day we dressed in pink to show our support for this message, but I also spoke about bullying at assemblies during the week with the hope of making bullying behaviours more easily identifiable for both perpetrators and victims. Bullying has no place in our school, and we encourage our students to be upstanders and not bystanders if they witness it. To help get the message across, our student leaders created this heartwarming video encouraging our students to stand together against bullying. Ka rawe student leaders!

Thank you for your support as we implement our new phone rules in line with the legislation that came into effect this term. We do understand that it's onerous for parents to have to come and pick up their student's phones when a phone breach occurs, but we hope that these breaches will tail off once students become used to the new rules. STUDENT PHONE POLICY AND LAW CHANGE. Phones Away For The Day

Thank you to our students, whanau and staff for navigating these changes with AROHA. If you have not yet read the policy and the law change please see the information shared via email and on our website.



The sliding scale of phone policy consequences to be aware of are:

- 1st incident, phone impounded and the student collects at 3pm from the Student Centre Office.
- 2nd incident onward: Caregivers/Emergency contacts must pick up the phone.
- To ensure the phone goes to the correct individual the following process will be followed:
- Only caregivers/emergency contacts registered with the school will be able to pick up the phone Persons collecting the phone must show ID
- Caregivers/emergency contacts collecting phones will be asked to sign to confirm collection.
- Timing for Collecting Phones: 8am 3:30 pm on Tuesdays; 8am 4:15pm all other weekdays. Collection is not possible on weekends.
- 3rd incident will result in a meeting with whānau.
