



Earlier this month we communicated via email and school apps that the Kaipara College social media had been compromised. This affected our Kaipara College Facebook account, the KC Facebook Messenger, the KC International & Arts Facebook pages and our Centenary Event on the KC Facebook page.

The **GREAT NEWS** is our Kaipara College website, Centenary online registration system, our Instagram account, Kaipara College Sports Facebook and all other online/IT systems such as Sporty, the School Bridge Portal and school emails etc. are all safe & secure!

The compromise likely came from an offshore phishing email. It is unfortunate that even here in this little corner of Aotearoa we can get caught up in these modern day tech issues. Thankfully we were made aware early.

What you need to know:

- We've deleted as much of the compromised Kaipara College Facebook profile as we can, including content and events.
- We advise you to not engage with any unusual posts or messages from the now largely blank Kaipara College account it remains out of our control. Do not click on any unusual links or share information that may be requested.
- We recommend that if you follow Kaipara College on Facebook including our Arts & International pages that you unfollow these.

What's next:

We are working to create a new Facebook presence and will announce this through official school channels as soon as we can. In the meantime, stay up to date with all things Kaipara College and the Centenary via the school website and also via our Kaipara College Instagram account.
