Kaipara College needs board members who reflect the diversity of our vibrant community. From farmers to office workers, caregivers to retirees, tradies to professionals – anyone can stand for election. If you're a parent, caregiver or legal guardian of a student enrolled full-time, you're eligible to both vote and stand as a parent representative. This is your opportunity to influence how our school is run at the highest level.

So, what exactly does the School Board do?

The board has legal responsibility and accountability for the overall performance and wellbeing of the school. Under the Education and Training Act 2020, board members are charged with ensuring every student achieves their full potential, providing a safe learning environment, and upholding the principles of Te Tiriti o Waitangi. This includes setting the school's strategic direction, overseeing financial decisions, approving key policies, and engaging with the wider school community.

Importantly, the board does not manage the daily running of the school – that's the role of the principal and staff. Instead, board members are strategic leaders, helping guide Kaipara College into the future.

You may be wondering if you have the right skills. The truth is, most of the qualities a good board member needs aren't found on a CV. If you can work well in a team, ask thoughtful questions, communicate clearly, and stay connected to what's happening in your community, you've got what it takes. Training and support are provided, so you won't be left to figure it out alone.

Standing for the School Board role is a chance to be an advocate for students, to be a supporter of teachers, and a champion for progress. Whether you're looking to give back to the community, develop leadership skills, or help shape the future of local education, becoming a board member is a powerful and rewarding way to get involved.

## Setting Behaviour and Learning Expectations at Kaipara College.

As part of our ongoing commitment to providing a safe, respectful, and positive learning environment for all students, Kaipara College has been holding assemblies with our Year 9 & 10 students to address current behavioural concerns and reset our expectations moving forward. While other year levels have not had an assembly the expectations are the same for all students. To reinforce this messaging we want whānau to have this information too.

While the vast majority of our students consistently uphold our school values and engage positively in their learning, a small number are demonstrating patterns of disruption and disrespect that undermine our learning environments. The following outlines our clear expectations of all students here at Kaipara College.

#### 1) Our expectations are simple and non-negotiable

Respect for self, others, and property; being in the right place at the right time; being ready to learn with the correct uniform and appropriate learning tools (Chromebook, charger, correct stationery – and phones away), and living by our school WAKA values.

#### 2) Meeting our expectations

Students who are as yet unable to meet behaviour expectations will be supported to do so. Part of this may be engaging with the restorative process. Students who repeatedly fail to meet these expectations will go through our discipline process with whānau involved.

We appreciate whānau support in reinforcing these expectations at home and in helping us maintain a calm, focused culture for learning at Kaipara College. Please feel free to contact your student's Kaitiaki (Dean), with regards to these expectations or any behaviour of concern.

## THE SAFETY NET PROJECT

We need your help to make a difference in the lives of young people in our community. Right now, if a young person is experiencing or at risk of homelessness, there's no guarantee they'll have a safe place to stay.

Massey Community Trust, Kaipara College and Outwest Youth are working together to respond to this need in our local community. Our goal is to ensure that when a young person is at risk of homelessness, we can intervene early, ensure they're safe, and connected to any support needed.

The Safety Net is a host home initiative that provides a safe,

supported, and healing alternative to motels as emergency accommodation for young people aged 16-24. Short-term host homes offer a safe place for rangatahi who are experiencing homelessness. We're looking for compassionate, caring individuals or whānau willing to welcome a young person into their home and their lives as part of this project. **Could this be you?**

### **CAREGIVERS AND STUDENTS MUST READ THIS INFORMATION.**

#### Kaipara College is a uniform school.

Students are required to wear the correct school uniform at all times.

In rare circumstances, where students may not be able to wear a uniform item for medical reasons etc, whānau must write a note to the school explaining the circumstances and the school will issue a permit which is only available from the Kaitiaki/Deans office.

The school reserves the right to require students not in correct uniform to wear loan items of uniform while at school. These are issued on a day by day basis. Loan items not returned will be charged for.

## Students who refuse to swap items will be sent home or given an after school consequence dependent on the situation.

If a student wears an incorrect item of clothing this will be impounded ie. hoodies, jackets etc. Whānau can collect these items from the Student Centre during school hours. All Whānau must report to the main office in the first instance. Any uncollected items are to be collected by the student at the end of each term at either interval or lunch time on the last day of term.

The school <u>will not</u> grant permission for students to wear non-uniform items on an extended basis, unless approval has been given by the Deputy Principal in charge of uniform or the Principal. **Permission will only be granted in medical circumstances where there is appropriate medical documentation provided.**
