Principal's Kōrero

Earlier this month, a group of our students gave up their day to volunteer as course marshals at the Tough Guy and Gal Challenge at the Kumeu Show Grounds, out on the course in all weather, helping competitors of every age get through the mud, the water and the obstacles. During the race, there was an event on that course that captured all of our values and showed exactly what our school is all about.

One family wrote to us afterwards to share what our students meant to them that day. Their child had signed up for the challenge and found herself struggling partway through, overwhelmed by fear and doubt as the obstacles grew tougher. student

What turned her around, the parent told us, was the encouragement of our marshals: their patience, their energy, their positivity and their refusal to let her give up on herself. She finished the course, and her family called it a memory they will carry for a long time.

That single afternoon captured everything Te WAKA o Kaipara stands for. Our students showed whanaungatanga, building a genuine connection with a stranger who needed one. They showed aroha, meeting her fear and tears with warmth rather than impatience. They showed kaitiakitanga, taking responsibility for someone else's wellbeing on that course as though she were one of their own.

And when she crossed the finish line, they shared in her angitūtanga, her success, cheering as loudly as if it were their own.

We do not always get to see our values in action so clearly, or hear about it afterwards. Most days that looks like everyday things, a classroom, a corridor, a small act of kindness no one sees. This time, a grateful parent took the trouble to write and tell us, and I am glad they did.

I could not be prouder of the young people who represented Kaipara College, not only on that day but for the whole event. Well done to all of you.

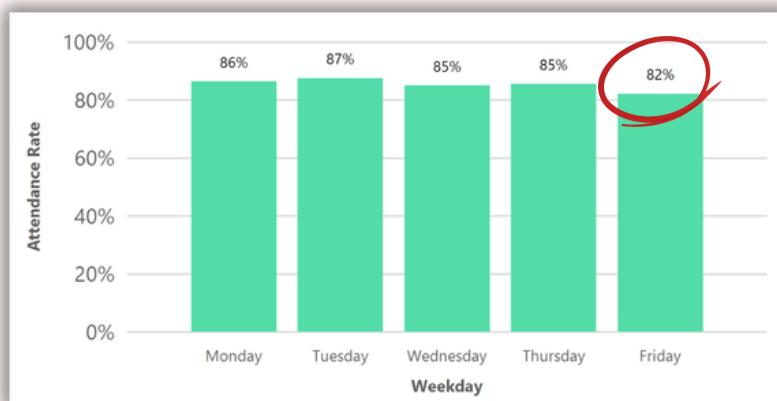

2026 Attendance Summary

At our school, we have an Attendance Management Plan which includes the Staged Attendance Response (STAR) framework set out by the Ministry of Education. The STAR framework is as follows:

- Green** - Good: Absent from school for less than 4.5 days in a term.
- Yellow** - Worrying: Absent from school for 5 - 9.5 days in a term.
- Orange** - Concerning: Absent from school for 10 - 14.5 days in a term.
- Red** - Serious Concern: Absent from school for 15 or more days in a term.

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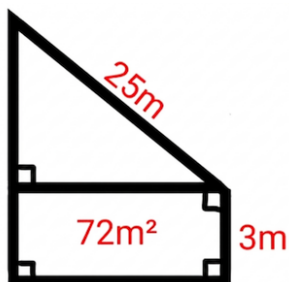

Whānau Maths Challenge

Can your family solve this geometry puzzle shared by Mr Yamamoto



The Goal:

Find the total perimeter (the total distance around the very outside edge of the shape).

Whānau Clue: Only count the outer boundary - ignore internal dividing lines! Start by using the rectangle's area (72m^2) to find its width, then use Pythagoras Theorem for the triangle height. Answer in next week's newsletter.

Derived Grade Exams for Seniors

Derived Grade Exams are coming up fast so we're resharing important information emailed to whānau on 14 August.

Dates: Monday 7 September - Friday 11 September
Exam timetables included with email on 14 August

- All Year 11 to 13 students are on Study Leave for the week of Derived Grade Exams. Students should be studying from home when not attending their scheduled exam or workshop.
- Students must arrive outside the Hall at least 15 minutes before the start of their exam.
- Students sitting digital exams must bring a fully charged laptop or Chromebook.
- If attending a workshop, students are required to remain in the designated space for the duration of their workshop.
- Exams take priority over workshops if a clash occurs.
- Students who need to catch the bus may use the library for quiet study before or after their exam or workshop session.
- Buses will run at their usual times. Please note:
 - Morning exams run from 9:00AM-12:00PM.
 - Afternoon exams run 1:00PM-3:00PM.
- Students must remain in their exam for at least the first 45 minutes before being permitted to leave. They may not leave in the last 15 minutes.
- Year 9 and Year 10 classes will run as usual during the Derived Grade Exams week.
- All exams and workshops are compulsory unless a student has been told directly by their teacher that they do not need to attend.

Why Derived Grade Exams Matter

NZQA requires schools to collect valid and authentic assessment evidence to use if a student applies for a derived grade (for example, in the event of illness, injury, or family emergency during the external exam period at the end of the year). These school-based exams are the primary source of evidence used to ensure fairness and consistency for all candidates.

If you have any questions students are encouraged to contact their classroom teacher in the first instance. For any exam clashes, students should contact Mrs Aziz directly via email at baziz@kaipara.school.nz with details of their clash so that an alternative time can be arranged.
